#### **CEO's Corner**

Here we are, at the end of yet another financial year! These annual milestones provide us the opportunity for review and reflection. Currently we are reviewing data collection, CRM system and the financial year end and we are planning all of our activities in line with the 2024-2025 year budget.

On reflection, we have delivered an outstanding body of work over the last 12 months achieving all the milestones we set and then a few more including; StepUP

2024, the whole of Association Christmas Party, three World Down Syndrome Day events and our first ever Siblings camp, Employment for 3 more people with Down syndrome, a fabulous Relationships workshop, Keyword signs and all of our social group activities. We have also continued to learn, discuss and support those affected with regression symptoms. Finally, we participated in providing feedback on a range of Policies and reviews, the NDIS review and the Disability Royal Commission findings, providing feedback through our Federation partner DSA. We have had a lot of laughs and fun with members, and some deep sadness too which have impacted us all. We are looking forward to this next financial year and continuing to work on delivering the best service we can.

As you are aware, maintaining a financially sustainable Association is an ongoing challenge with funding from Government, Philanthropists and our own community being critical for our success. Following this ENews will be an email for me, which will hopefully provide you with more understanding of how the Association is funded and how / where we need additional support to ensure the future of the Association. All of our income needs can't be provided by Government, and as such we need to find ways we can all contribute to financial success.

For the coming 12 months, we have some exciting projects and activities planned, however many will be dependent on our capacity to cover their costs. We are all looking forward to the World Down Syndrome Congress and are extremely proud to see so many WA members speaking on the program. Congress will also see Nikki Schwagermann (Mum and Staff Member) and Emily McCain (Mum and DSWA Board member) talking about their journey as parents of two teens with Down syndrome and I am delighted to be speaking and presenting the pilot data from WA's Regression Symptoms survey that has now gone national. The survey now has over 35 responses giving us invaluable data to move forward with. On August 16th and 17th we will be attending the Disability Expo at the PCEC, the 2025 Playgroup Calendar shoot will go ahead with 24 committed families already signed up for their Calendar spot and September will see production of the Annual Report ready for the AGM on 23 October.

October is a full month. October is AGM Month, and it would be lovely to have the AGM be a time to catch up with old friends, learn what is to come with the Board strategy and reflect on this year which is about to close, I hope we will see more of you at the AGM as an opportunity to celebrate all we are as a community.

StepUP has continued to evolve and change over the years, with last year having wonderful activities, rides, market stalls, fabulous adventure walk and entertainment, however it was our lowest attendance to date and hence our lowest fundraising in StepUP history, deeply impacting DSWA's finances. So, this year we are trying something new StepUP and Dance for Down Syndrome. **Save the date!** 

**Sunday 6 October**. There is much more news to come on this fun event. We will attend the Telethon Family Fun day again in late October and in November we will be heading to the Darlington Arts Festival with our DSWA Artists to display and sell their work. The following weekend, we are holding our first ever Teen Getaway proudly sponsored by Telethon 7. See further in the eNews for more information. This will then lead us into our second All of Association Christmas Party, on December 6 and we hope as many of you with all of your children, and family will come and join us.

As you are aware, in May, we sent a number of advocacy letters of to various State and Federal Ministers, asking for reconsideration of the ILC funding for the next 2 years. As a result Employment Coordination grant has been rolled over for another 12 months, however there has been no movement on ILC, which means that unfortunately our Pathways project, and all of its associated workshops over the last 3 years will no longer be available through grant funding. We are looking at ways to continue to deliver these to the community with a cost recovery model which does mean having to charge for workshops and courses. As with other services, we may now have to implement some fee for service work for that work, which is unfunded. Thank you to those that sent letters to Ministers, we greatly appreciate your support.

Since our last eNews, I have attended the Siblings Camp, which was a huge success. It was wonderful to see the group bond and watch friendships begin. We hope our siblings will come along to other events like StepUP and Christmas party where they can catch up again. Our biggest thanks to the Siblings Project team, Emma and Kate for your wonderful research and for supporting the Siblings Camp. I had the privilege this month to also attend a presentation by a group of Masters Students from UWA who worked on a project called Enhancing Awareness and Understanding of Dementia and Regression Disorder in Down Syndrome. From this venture, two students are coming on board to volunteer for DSWA and support me in the DSRD project.

This week, I am busily finalising the 2024-2025 budget for the board to consider, and preparing for the World Down Syndrome Congress being held in Brisbane. And finally, the BIG news - you can put the 2025 Gala in your diary. We have booked a new, bigger venue and the Gala will be held on Saturday 3 May 2025. Save the date, this is going to be a fantastic event celebrating Family and Friends.

We have just 3 days left until the end of financial year. We ask you to consider everything that membership brings you, Advocacy when you need it, Connection, Friendship, Resources, Events and Activities, Community Awareness and most importantly your Connection to others. We ask to to consider making a donation this year, perhaps in lieu of not having to pay membership fees. #### **Relationships Course**

The sounds of excitement and chatter fill the room at the Relationships Course. Learning, conversing and sharing tips on going on a date. Appropriate people to ask, understand who is not appropriate and how to ask someone out. Getting ready, looking your best, what to wear, thinking about subjects to chat about. And of course, how to stay safe on a date.

The extremely important topic of consent and what that means was covered in detail and reiterated weekly. Understanding your right to say NO, asking questions if you don't understand and the right to change your mind.

And the delicate but necessary topic of intimacy and sex. Including the seriousness of it, understanding if you are ready for it, trust and safety.

The course has been extremely well received, participants had the time to get to know each other which gave them the courage and confidence to speak up and join in the very important conversation.

The participants are excited and ready for next week's final session of the course – Speed dating. Where they can practice social engagement, conversation/connection skills, honouring boundaries, and enjoy the opportunity to engage in a safe environment with peers, with the possibility of meeting new friends or potentially someone they might go on a date with.




## Friends for Life
